Discussion:

The Lake Vista Pump Station is deteriorating, requiring frequent repairs for continued operation. With growth steadily increasing in the system and the pump station nearing the end of its service life as it is fully depreciated, the pump station is in need of replacement in the near future. The abandonment of the station by constructing a gravity sewer line directly into the City's Ivy Creek Interceptor would provide the additional capacity to the systems as well as eliminate significant operational expenses associated with keeping the pump station active.

This project is the last phase necessary to allow the Lake Vista Pump Station to be removed from service. It consists of abandoning the pump station and extending gravity sewer from the pump station location to the City's boundary to connect to Ivy Creek Sewer Phase 5. Sewer transmission through these mains is not possible without Ivy Creek Sewer Phase 5 project.
